## JACK GIBBONS plays GEORGE GERSHWIN Queen Elizabeth Hall, Thursday 16th July 1998

"A unique testimony to Gershwin's genius" (Classic CD)

George Gershwin, born 100 years ago this year, occupies a unique position among composers in being equally at home in both the musical theatre and the concert hall. In this special tri-partite concert celebrating his remarkable life and music, world-renowned Gershwin exponent Jack Gibbons, hot-foot from standing ovations at New York's Lincoln Center, traces Gershwin's life at the piano, covering the whole gamut of his output, including ever-popular hit songs such as Swanee, I Got Rhythm, The Man I Love etc., exhilarating concert works such as Rhapsody in Blue, Cuban Overture and An American in Paris, spectacular dance music (written for Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers) such as Let's Call The Whole Thing Off, and the immortal opera Porgy & Bess.

Described by the BBC as "THE Gershwin pianist of our time", Jack Gibbons has become recognised on both sides of the Atlantic as one of the world authorities on the music of George Gershwin. His unique all-Gershwin programmes feature his own recreations of Gershwin's original unpublished piano improvisations, reconstructed note-fornote from Gershwin's original recordings made in the 1920s and 30s. These reconstructions are now the subject of an award-winning 4-CD set of recordings entitled "The Authentic George Gershwin" - over 41/2 hours of original Gershwin material described by Edward Jablonski, Gershwin's biographer and long-time friend of the Gershwin family, as "THE outstanding survey of George Gershwin's work". The latest volume to be released (Volume 4, "The Hollywood Years") was recently described by Classic CD magazine as "unimpeachable... all the superlatives already heaped on Volumes 1-3 of Jack Gibbons's ASV series 'The Authentic George Gershwin' can be re-amassed on Volume 4". Classic FM magazine described the new album as "a real labour of love and not a little musical scholarship - though you'd never guess it from Gibbons's infectious playing".
